The Shade Tree and Beautification Committee

Phase II plans for improvements to our downtown district are underway! In 2023, the scope of work will encompass improvements to Borough Hall and the areas of Sheridan Avenue between Warren Avenue and North Franklin Turnpike, and East Franklin Turnpike. Phase I in 2022 completed attractive improvements to the Town Green, Memorial Park, and Sycamore Avenue.

The Beautification Committee was formed in April 2022 pursuant to Mayor and Council Resolution #22-63. Mayor Randall appointed the following Committee Members: Executive Committee Council Members Kevin Crossley (Chairman), Edmund lannelli, and Dane Policastro. General Members Lourdes Carus, Cassie Cavallo, Dannie Chase, Ron Forcellati, Megan Fox, Missy McCloskey, Jeff Pattman, Kathleen Raschdorf, Steve Scanapico, and Max Stokes.

The Committee works collaboratively in an advisory capacity to the Mayor and Council to make aesthetic improvements that reflect the charm of our downtown district through streetscape design, plantings, landscaping, hardscape, and other recommended projects, in a pedestrian friendly atmosphere.

The 10 Orvil Court Improvements Committee

is making excellent progress in our consideration of relocating the Ho-Ho-Kus Library to the former Bank of America building. Heuer & Company has been retained for professional consulting services, and Arcari + Iovino Architects is conducting a feasibility study intended to identify the likely size, configuration, parking, and potential cost, as well as the physical limitations and opportunities of the property. The Committee will submit this information to the Mayor & Council for consideration.

The Borough purchased the building in 2022. Apublic meeting held on November 28, 2022 to determine public interest of relocating the library received overwhelming support. Consequently, on January 4, 2023 the Mayor & Council passed Resolution #23-32 forming the 10 Orvil Court Improvements Committee. Mayor Randall appointed the following Committee Members: Councilman Dane Policastro (Chairman), Council President Doug Troast, and Councilman Kevin Crossley, Library Board of Trustees President John Mongelli, Trustees Jeff Clutterbuck and Leann Surz, Library Director Morgan Taylor, and Chamber of Commerce Co-President, Max Stokes.

Committee progress is reported each month at our Mayor & Council meetings.





New Water Filtration System – We are happy to inform our residents that the NJDEP has granted final approval. The Borough awarded a contract in April and began work on May 1st for a water filtration system designed to remove the PFOA and PFNA contaminates from our water system. We have held a preconstruction meeting as we continue to fast track the process. Our contract calls for all the sitework to be completed this summer while we wait 40 weeks for the filter system delivery (based on current supply chain issues). We expect to meet our goal of having this project finished by the Spring of 2024. The DEP has recognized the Borough's nonstop efforts to move this critical project forward by granting an extension until May 15, 2024, for completion. Please be aware that we are required by law to send out quarterly notices of violation until this project is completed.


Water Sprinkler Reminder: We want to remind you as you are opening, or just activated your sprinklers, that Memorial Day marks the beginning of the watering restrictions which last through Labor Day. Please check that your timers are set according to your zone which can be found on the Borough's website under the Water/Sewer Departments page. Over 98% of residents' concerns for high water bills are due to excessive watering and non-adherence to the watering restrictions.



Example of a data log of a toilet running/ continuous leak — 278,881/gal over a 90day period = \$3,026 bill




Example of a Data Log of watering every day but Monday – 77,577/gal over a 90-day period = \$686 bill

The Borough's Budget has been adopted and is available for review on the Borough's website under the Finance page. The Governing Body approved an increase of 1.9 tax points (as low as any reported in the area this year - many towns have record-breaking increases) on the 29% of your tax bill the Mayor and Council control. This equates to 50 cents per day or \$15 per month on the average home. The following chart shows the breakdown of your property tax bill.



Borough property taxes have four components with the Municipal Services portion comprising 29% of the total property tax bill.

that the Borough now accepts online payments for Property Taxes, Solid Waste and Water Utilities? You now have a fast, easy, and safe option to pay by credit card, debit card or echeck. As a registered user, you can save accounts, store payment methods and schedule payments. Click on the Borough website On-Line Payments icon to register.

Here are some helpful reminders from the Ho-Ho-Kus PD and Chief LaCroix:

- Lock your vehicles, regardless of the time of day and remember to remove the key FOB.
- Please make sure all doors to your house are secured each evening prior to going to sleep.
- If you have an alarm, please activate it, whether at night or leaving for the day.
- Please keep in mind that there is no overnight parking allowed within the Borough from the hours of 4-6 a.m. If you need to leave a car on the street, there is a link on our website (hohokuspolice.com) or call the desk directly to register your vehicle for the evening.
- No commercial vehicle is permitted overnight in any residential neighborhood, whether on the street or in a driveway.
- If you see something suspicious, please notify our Police desk immediately at 201-652-1700.
- Be mindful of your vehicle speed when traveling on Borough roads. Speeding is still an issue and to date, our department has conducted 632 traffic details on various roads in an effort to slow drivers down.
- Lastly, with the warmer months fast approaching, there are more pedestrians walking throughout the town. Please remember that under NJ law, all vehicles MUST STOP for pedestrians in a crosswalk.


