## **ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES and PUBLIC HEARING**

### **Ordinance #2023-88**

#### AN ORDINANCE TO CLARIFY CHAPTER 38-1 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HO-HO-KUS

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus has heretofore adopted Chapter 38-1 of the Code of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus; and **WHEREAS**, the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus wishes to clarify Chapter 38-1 as it relations to the consumption of alcohol on Borough owned property or public buildings;

**NOW, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey as follows:

### SECTION I

Chapter 38-1 of the Code is hereby amended as follows: (*new items in italics*, <del>deletions in strikethrough</del>) § 38-1**Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in public.** 

<u>A.</u> No person shall consume any alcoholic beverages within the limits of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus or have in his possession any opened alcoholic beverage container with unconsumed alcoholic beverage therein while in or on a public street, lane, roadway, avenue, sidewalk, public parking place, park, playground recreation area, school buildings or grounds, **public building or grounds, municipal facility, municipal owned or leased property,** or any other public or quasi-public place; or in any public conveyance; or in a private motor vehicle while the same is in motion or parked in any public street, lane or public parking lot or other public or quasi-public place; or while upon any private property not his own without the express permission of the owner or other person having authority to grant such permission.

**B.** Notwithstanding anything hereinabove contained, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus may authorize the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in any designated park or other public place under its jurisdiction at the designated time or times in connection with a special event which shall have been authorized by a resolution of the Mayor and Council.

#### Section II Severability

If any section, sentence or any other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not effect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance but shall be confined in its effect to the section, sentence or other part of this Ordinance directly involved in the controversy which such judgment shall be rendered.

#### Section III Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.

All ordinances or parts or ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

## Section IV Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

#### Resolution #23-100

#### A Resolution - HHK Security Camera – Memorandum of Understanding between BOE & HHK

WHEREAS, pursuant to P.L. 2017, c. 119, effective July 21, 2017, if at least one school building of a school district is equipped with video surveillance equipment that is capable of streaming live video wirelessly to a remote location, the Board of Education and local law enforcement must enter into a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") which provides the authorities with the capacity to activate the equipment and view the live streaming video; and

WHEREAS, a representative of the Ho-Ho-Kus Public School District Board of Education and the Ho-Ho-Kus Chief of Police have met and proposed the attached MOU to be entered into between the parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus for good cause that it does hereby approve the attached MOU and hereby authorizes the Chief of Police to execute same on behalf of the Borough.

#### Memorandum of Understanding

#### Between

#### The Ho-Ho-Kus Public School District Board of Education

#### and

#### The Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "Memorandum") is made this 22 day of August, 2023, by and between the Board of Education of The Ho-Ho-Kus Public School District (hereinafter referred to as "Board") and the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus Police Department (hereinafter referred to as "Department"), (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties").

WHEREAS, a Uniform State Memorandum of Agreement between Education and Law Enforcement Officials exists in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Department is the designated local law enforcement agency for the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus; and WHEREAS, NJ P.L. 2017, c. 119, requires a Board of Education to enter into a separate Memorandum of

Understanding with local law enforcement authorities if at least one of its school buildings is equipped with video surveillance equipment that is capable of streaming live video to a remote location; and

**WHEREAS**, video surveillance equipment that is capable of streaming live video to a remote location exists between the Board and the Department;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED:

- 1. The Board reserves the express right to determine the placement of video surveillance equipment throughout the school district that is capable of providing live streaming video that may be accessed remotely by the Department.
- 2. The Department's Chief of Police and the Board's Chief School Administrator and/or their designee shall meet at least once annually to discuss a list of designated employees of the Department (hereinafter referred to as "designated employees") who are authorized to view live streaming video of the Board at a remote location.

The designated list shall include each Department employee's name, contact information, position, rank, and supervisor's contact information. The designated list shall be attached herein by reference as "Attachment A."

The Parties agree that the designated employees of the Department as set forth in Attachment A shall be permitted to activate and view the live streaming video at a remote location under a video surveillance operation plan. The Chief School Administrator will be afforded the opportunity to offer specific concerns regarding the circumstances of any video surveillance, and will also be given the opportunity to make general or specific recommendations as to how to minimize the impact of the proposed surveillance on the education environment, personnel privacy, and the relationship between school authorities, the law enforcement community, and the student population. In developing a video surveillance operation plan, and throughout the course of operation, the Department will give due consideration to the concerns and recommendations offered by the Chief School Administrator. Furthermore, the Chief School Administrator will be advised the specific times of the school day, and times outside the school day, when the designated employees will have remote access to the live streamed video.

- 4. The Parties agree that in order for the Department to ensure that remote location unauthorized access to live streaming video shall be prevented and detected, the Department shall take reasonable precautions to prevent unauthorized use and detection of same including, but not limited to, by providing training to the designated employees on an annual basis.
- 5. In the event that designated employees of the Department record any live stream video footage, the Parties agree that only those designated employees shall be permitted to access the saved footage. Such access shall be limited to official business of the Department. The saved video will be kept strictly confidential and will not be divulged to any other person by the Department without the express approval of the County Prosecutor or, where appropriate, the NJ Attorney General or his/her designee.
- 6. The Parties agree that if either the Board or the Department breach the terms of this Memorandum the other Party reserves the right to immediately terminate the live streaming video surveillance access of the Board to the Department.
- 7. This Memorandum shall be effective from the date of execution through August 31, 2024.
- 8. This Memorandum contains the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties.
- 9. If a specific clause of this Memorandum is determined to be illegal or in violation of any Federal or State law, the remainder of the Memorandum shall not be affected by such ruling and shall remain in full force and effect.
- 10. The Parties shall be bound by the terms and conditions of this Memorandum.
- 11. The Parties have entered into this Memorandum in accordance with the requirements of N.J.P.L. 2017, c. 119.
- **IN WITNESS THEREOF**, the Parties hereunder set their hands and seals to this Memorandum of Understanding effective on the 22 day of August, 2023.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ho Ho-Kus has received a request for a street closure from resident Chris Clasen; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus, that the request for the street closure is approved.

#### Resolution #23-102

A Resolution - Authorize Street Closure Addison Place – Block Party

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ho Ho-Kus has received a request for a street closure from resident Annabelle Petriella; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Petriella is requesting that Addison Place closed from on September 24, 2023 from 3:00pm - 6:00pm with a rain date of October  $1^{st}$ ;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus, that the request for the street closure is approved.

Resolution #23-103

A Resolution – Forgiveness o f Solid Waste Bills – 3<sup>rd</sup> qtr.

WHEREAS, 58 Jacquelin Ave, 2 Pitcairn Ave, 109 Arbor Dr, 849 Wickham Way, and 12 Powderhorn Rd, which are lots under construction; and

WHEREAS, the above residential structures and lots will be credited accordingly and then will be reviewed for the balance.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the bills in question be cancelled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution shall be sent to the Water & Solid Waste Registrar.

Resolution #23-104

A Resolution - Suspension of Enforcement of Ordinance 38-1 for "Mutual Aid Event"

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus has previously adopted Section 38-1 of the Code of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus which prohibits the consumption or possession of opened alcoholic beverage containers within the Borough's municipal limits; and

WHEREAS, under Section 38-1(b) the Governing Body may authorize the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in any designated park or other public place under its jurisdiction at the designated time or times in connection with a special event which shall have been authorized by a resolution of the Mayor and Council; and WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to permit alcohol at its Fire House on **September 6, 2023** and wishes to permit the

consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages from open containers within certain geographic and consumption limits; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus also wishes to continue to prohibit public intoxication or the consumption of alcohol by minors;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body that the consumption and possession of alcohol from open containers shall be permitted at a mutual aid event on **September 6, 2023** only, and that the provisions of Section 38-1 are hereby suspended at the above date and times, subject to the conditions below:

• The Fire Department and its Mutual Aid invitees, who shall be personally involved in the event, are permitted to use the Fire House and Council Chambers for their business, but no alcohol shall be permitted in the Council Chambers or Borough Hall, other than the second floor of the Fire House. Alcohol use is permitted indoors at the Fire House (second floor) only. No guests shall consume alcohol other than such participants.

- No hard liquor can be served and alcohol shall be limited to two (2) beers or wine only per member.
- Beer shall be in 12 oz. bottles/cans only no draft beer shall be served.

• At least 1 elected and in good standing HHKFD Officer shall certify to the Borough Administrator, in writing, prior to the event that he or she shall be responsible for enforcing the alcohol limits in this Resolution and such person must be present for the duration of the event. Such person shall also be responsible for making sure no public intoxication or serving of visibly intoxicated individuals occurs.

• The elected HHKFD Officers - present or not - are responsible for the function and all attendees while on premises, and shall establish rules to ensure compliance with this Resolution.

• The use of and consumption of alcohol shall be from 8 pm-11pm only.

• If the function ends earlier, all beer/wine consumption shall end if the last HHKFD Officer leaves the building if before 11pm.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing herein shall be construed to permit any individual from being in a state of public intoxication, or to permit the consumption of alcohol by minors under the age of 21;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Police Department is authorized to take all steps to implement this Resolution

A motion was offered by Council President Troast and seconded by Councilman Crossley to approve Resolutions #23-99 thru #23-104. Motion carried on a roll call vote – All present voting "Aye".
