PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Mayor Randall opened the meeting to the public. He stated if anyone desired to be heard, please raise your and to be recognized, and state your name for the record.

Carol Tyler

Ms. Tyler stated the borough is in need of more DPW workers as they are short staffed. She suggested putting together a committee of council people involved in finding, advertising and hiring. Secondly, she questioned the status of the FD situation. Borough Attorney Wiss stated there was a hearing this morning, the judge adjourned until October 17th. He explained the Mayor & Council are the defendants in this case, they have no control. Ms. Tyler added this is dividing the town. There should be no "he said, she said", pointing the finger, hating each other, this has to stop. Councilman Iannelli stated there is no "he said she said", there is not hatred from this governing body. There is nothing that this governing body can do bring anyone else into a room and say "hey let's stop this". Those attempts have been made. Mayor Randall added, he understands her frustrations, this is not good for anybody. We look forward to a conclusion. Mayor also stated he would like to thanked the DPW workers, not only did they help clean-up, but was helping everyone take down tents as the storm was coming in.

Karen Zatorski

Ms. Zatorski asked what is happening with the library and 10 Orvil Court? Mayor responded nothing has been finalized. We had a feasible study done and we are still in discussion with the library. Secondly, Ms. Zatorski asked about what is happening with the water in town. Borough Administrator responded; the water tank project has been completed. Regarding the water filtration system, everything that can been done has been completed. We are waiting on the filter systems to come in, which we ordered in May, however it takes 40 weeks. We are looking for them to arrive sometime at the end of the year. The State has given the Borough until May of 2024 to complete the project. Lastly Ms. Zatorski asked for an update on the beautification at borough hall. Councilman Crossley responded, they finished the planters on Sheridan, Sycamore. In front of borough hall, they washed, painted, sided and put in new hardware in the front the building. Now they are ready to do the landscaping. Ms. Zatorski questioned how will you address what the eagle scouts did in the front of borough hall that was ripped out. Councilman Crossley responded we removed all the plaques so nothing would get damaged and we saved all the dedicated trees with the exception of Rusty Thompson's which was dead. All plaques will be put back and a tree for Rusty Tompson will be replaced.

Jack Craig

Mr. Craig explained he lives on Braeburn, he feels the road needs to be repaired/repaved by the intersection of Hollywood & Lloyd which is a very heavily traveled road and as asked if this something the borough controls. Mayor explained we control Lloyd but we do not control Hollywood as that is a county road, however we can make a request to them.

Julie Pritchard

Resident questioned when the timeframe for a decision on the relocation of the library. Councilman Policastro stated that is part of his report, which is the latter part of this meeting.

Mayor closed the meeting to the public.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

Ordinance #2023-89

ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 79 OF THE CODE ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, that Section 79-18 of the Code **Permits** is hereby amended as follows:

Section I

- A. No change.
- B. The fee to be charged by the Borough Clerk for the resident permits shall be \$500.00 and businessman permits shall be \$100.00. No fee shall be required for permits issued to Borough employees for parking during the regular course of business in Municipal Lot B.
- C.-F. No change.

Section II

Repealer

All other provisions of this Ordinance which are not affected by this amendatory Ordinance are hereby ratified and confirmed and shall remain in full force and effect. However, all ordinances or parts of ordinances, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this amendatory Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section III

Severability

If any portion of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance, but shall be confined in its effect to the provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section IV

Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to with: R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

LIAISON REPORTS

Recreation – Councilman Iannelli reported movie night was rained out, therefore it had to be moved to the following week. Unfortunately, attendance was not like it was in the past as it coincided with the holiday. HHK Day was still a success, we were able to get 3 ½ hours out of a 6 hour event. During that time approximately 2000 came through the town. Fall sports are underway.

Library – Circulation for the 2023 summer months from June to August were 6% lower than 2022. Current total

for the year is nearly equal to this time last year.

<u>Board of Education</u> – The groundbreaking ceremony for the Ho-Ho-Kus Public School Duffield Hall took place September 15th. Members of the Public School joined representatives of the Duffield Organization, project architect LAN Associates, Donnelly Construction, a representative from John Gottheimer's office, and members of the Ho-Ho-Kus Mayor and Council to commemorate the ground breaking of the athletic and wellness addition.

<u>10 Orvil Court Improvements</u> – The Feasibility Study is concluded. The Mayor and Council is presently in the process of reviewing the Study findings and recommendations and is in dialog with the Library Board of Trustees. The goal is to have a resolution for the potential build and relocation by the end of the year.

Ambulance Corps – No Report

<u>Shade Tree/Beautification</u> – Councilman Crossley gave his report in the beginning of the meeting (see under public discussion)

<u>Fire Department</u> – Councilman Shell reported the Fire Department had a strong contingent down at the annual meeting in Atlantic City. He continues to thank them for their service.

<u>Chamber of Commerce</u> – Councilman Shell reported the Chamber really appreciated HHK Day. They are also entertaining an opportunity that will coordinate with the Chamber with an Artison Fair on the town green sometime in the Spring.

<u>Police</u> - Chief LaCroix report a few of his officers are going to the Galloping Hills Golf Course to receive an award for "Safe Roads". Crime has been down; however, they have been dealing more with people crisis 3 to 4 times a week. Lastly, Officers Leif had his 2nd child, Garret has his first child and Pat's 3rd child is due Thursday.

<u>DPW</u> – Jeff Pattman, DPW Supervisor reported the DPW is gearing up for leaf season. Councilman Crossley added the DPW had been a great help with the beautification and thanked them for all their hard work. Administrator Jones stated they pump more water then last year, despite the numerous attempts to warn residents about over water, there are going to have high bills.

MAYOR COMMENT

Mayor Randall stated he would like to thank the people who came to our 911 observance, it's a short service but very poignant we remember.
