Ms. Mitchell asked what the status was with the tree ordinance that was presented to them in a past meeting. Administrator Jones responded; we are still waiting for some Departments/Boards reports that will be directly involved with these changes that are being requested. Council will then review the recommendations presented. Once that is all complete a meeting will be set-up with the Shade Tree. Looking at sometime next month.

# New Business

<u>Water bills</u> – Administrator Jones explained there were some concerns about high water bills, he explained we had the driest summer in the 300 year history of the town. We produced 36% more water from our system. To date 35/40 people have called and about a dozen data logs have been done. With those 12 it was one of three things that caused there bill to be higher. 95% was over watering, one was a toilet that ran for 5 straight days and the other was leak problem that we were able to help the resident fix.

# ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES and PUBLIC HEARING ORDINANCE 2022-73

### ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HO-HO-KUS TO ESTABLISH A REGISTRY FOR BUSINESS INSURANCE CERTIFICATES

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey has enacted a new statute which requires business owners and rental Unit owners to maintain certain liability insurance policies and register certificates of insurance demonstrating compliance with such statute with the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, the requirement to register a certificate of insurance shall be effective as of November 6, 2022, 90 days following enactment; and

**WHEREAS**, said law provides that the municipality may, by ordinance, establish a reasonable administrative fee for the certificate of registration;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that Chapter 37 of the Code of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus is hereby created and enacted as follows:

Chapter 37 - Certificate of insurance, annually registration of business, rental units, multi-family home

§ 37-1 -Establishment of a certificate of insurance registry for annual registration of business, rental units, multi-family home

- a. As required by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:10A-2, the owner of a business, owner of a rental unit or units, and the owner of a multi-family home of four or fewer units, one of which is owner occupied, shall annually register the certificate of insurance demonstrating compliance with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:10A-1 as set forth below.
- b. All business owners and rental unit owners as set forth above shall comply with the insurance requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:10A-1 and provide a certificate of insurance as required by statute to the office of the Borough Clerk on an annual basis, which office shall maintain a registry of certificates of insurance filed with it, and each registration shall be accompanied by payment of \$25.00 as an administrative fee for such registration.
- c. Penalty and Enforcement Any business owner who does not comply with this section shall be subject to enforcement of the registration provisions of this section, through a summary proceeding pursuant to the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.), of a fine of not less than \$500 but no more than \$5,000 against an owner who failed to comply with the provisions of this chapter.

### § 37-2 Severability.

If any portion of this chapter is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this chapter, but shall be confined in its effect to the provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

§ 37-3

When effective.

This chapter shall take effect after final passage and publication as required by law.

The Ordinance shall become effective immediately after publication in accordance with New Jersey law.

# ORDINANCE 2022-74

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE V, CHAPTER 85, ZONING OF THE BOROUGH OF HO-HO-KUS. THE FOLLOWING SECTION IS AMENDED. (banners)

**WHEREAS**, the Borough seeks to establish criteria to clarify the regulations pertaining to institutional signs in all districts; and

**WHEREAS**, to establish appropriate relationship of public informational banner signs to their surroundings and related criteria, some amendments to the zoning ordinance are reasonable and appropriate.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus, in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, that Article III section §85-37 entitled "Signs permitted for public and semipublic buildings" is hereby amended and supplemented in the existing code in the following particulars only: (deleted sections are noted by strikethroughs, new sections are <u>underlined</u>)

Section 1. Amend section §85-37 M. as follows:

(1) No signs or public informational banners are permitted on public or semi-public buildings, other than the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus may elect to erect or permit to be erected upon application a government speech sign expressing official sentiments, which are not intended to serve as a forum for free expression by the public Other institutional signs in all districts. Signs of other institutions of a Signs permitted under this Chapter similar public or semipublic nature may be erected and maintained, provided that:

(a) The size of any freestanding sign shall not exceed 16 square feet and not more than one such sign is placed on a property unless such property fronts upon more than one street, in which instance a sign

may be erected on each frontage. No freestanding sign shall be higher than six feet as measured from the average grade at the bottom of the sign.

(b) Signs affixed to the facade of the structure shall be permitted, provided that the sign shall not exceed 5% of the building facade. No such sign shall be higher than 20 feet as measured from the average facade elevation.

(2) <u>An approved municipal public informational banner shall be permitted at a Borough approved public property location. The size of such freestanding public informational banner sign shall be 48 inches high by 96 inches wide. Application for such banners shall be made at the Borough Zoning Department.</u>

<u>Section 2</u>. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or any other part of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance.

<u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>Section 4</u>. The Borough Clerk is hereby directed to give notice at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing on the adoption of this ordinance to the Bergen County Planning Board, and to all others entitled thereto pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:55D-15. Upon adoption of this ordinance, after public hearing thereon, the Borough clerk is further directed to publish notice of the passage thereof and to file copy of this ordinance as finally adopted with the Bergen County Planning Board as required by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:55D-16 and with the Borough Tax Assessor.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final passage and publication as prescribed by law.

**ORDINANCE #2022-75** 

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 81 OF THE CODE ENTITLED "WATER AND WATER RATES"

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus that Chapter 81 of the code is hereby amended as follows:

### 81-21 Rates and Charges is amended as follows:

- (a) Effective January 1, 2023 all water taken or consumed shall be charged to consumers at the following rates:
  - (1) Seven dollars (\$7.50) per one thousand (1,000) gallons, with a minimum charge of Sixty Dollars (\$60) per quarter, or any part thereof.
  - (2) For Water usage over the minimum the following chart will apply:

#### SECTION III:

Repealer.

All other ordinances of the Borough, or parts thereof, which are in conflict with this ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

### SECTION IV: Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

#### **ORDINANCE # 2022-76**

#### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CERTAIN PORTIONS OF CHAPTERS 77-9 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HO-HO-KUS ENTITLED "ELECTRICAL SUBCODE FEES"

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus that Chapter 77-9(B) of the code is hereby amended as follows (deletions in strikethrough and additions in **bold**):

B. For the purposes of calculating the following electrical fees, all motors except those plug-in appliances shall be counted, including control equipment, generators, transformers and all heating, cooking or other devices consuming or generating electrical current:

(1) Motors/electrical devices 1 to 5 horsepower: \$25.

(2) Motors/electrical devices 6 to 9 horsepower: \$50.

(3) Motors/electrical devices 10 to 15 horsepower: \$75.

(4) Motors/electrical devices to 26 horsepower: \$100.

- (5) Transformer/generator to 10 kilowatts: \$75.
- (6) Transformer/generator to 45 kilowatts: \$125.

(7) Transformer/generator to 112.5 kilowatts: \$175.

(8) Transformer/generator above 112.5 kilowatts: \$225.

(9) Service/panels/subpanels to 100 amperes: \$75.

- (10) Service/panels/subpanels to 200 amperes: \$125.
- (11) Service/panels/subpanels to 300 amperes: \$200.
- (12) Service/panels/subpanels to 400 amperes: \$250.
- (13) Service/panels/subpanels to 800 amperes: \$300.
- (14) Service/panels/subpanels to 1,000 amperes: \$450.
- (15) HVAC and Central AC per unit: \$75.
- (15) Solar Batteries to 10 kilowatts: \$75.
- (16) Solar Batteries to 45 kilowatts: \$125.
- (17) Solar Batteries to 112.5 kilowatts: \$175.

#### (18) Solar Batteries above 112.5 kilowatts: \$225

All other sections not heretofore amended shall remain in full force and effect.

### SECTION II: Repealer.

All other ordinances of the Borough, or parts thereof, which are in conflict with this ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

#### SECTION III: Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

# LIAISON REPORTS

<u>Recreation</u> – Councilman Iannelli reported there was a recreation meeting on October 13<sup>th</sup>. HHK/Saddle River Basketball has combined with the Quad teams to now form the Highland Travel Basketball League. They will still be under the HHK/Saddle River Insurance for the time being. This leaves Soccer as the only sport that stands alone as an HHK/Saddle River sport. The Soccer Association has concerns regarding the disrepair of North Field and Llyod Field with reported injuries over the last few months. They feel it is being over used. It has come to their attention the school fields are being used by IHA for Soccer & Field Hockey. He stated we need to address this issues with Dr. Mardy, superintendent of the school and the concern citizens. Councilman continued stated there is also an issue that there is no assess to the restrooms at Lloyd Field. We need to find a solution to allow them the use of the restrooms at the school or to put in porta johns.

<u>Library</u> - Councilman Policastro reported circulation for the month of September was 19% under August, this decrease meets our post-summer expectations. Overall circulation is up from last year it has not return from pre-pandemic levels. In 2023 the NJ State will increase the 1/3 mill by 5.66%. Lastly, a new Youth Service Librarian started October 17<sup>th</sup>. The Adult Program Coordinator has not yet been hired.

<u>Board of Education</u> – Councilman Policastro reported Dr. Mardy's October 7<sup>th</sup> monthly school letter recognized OEM Coordinator Jay Ludwig, Police Chief Mike Lacroix, Captain Greg McBain, Rev Richard Bierwas and DPW Supervisor, Jeff Pattman for their contribution to the planning and support of the school successful evacuation drill. Additional she recognized DPW workers, Police Officers and others at the Community Church for their ground assistance during the drill. During fire prevention week, the HHK Fire Department presented the students with the importance of fire safety and gave groups a close view of a fire truck. Detective Balastrieri gave a presentation to parents on harassment, intimidation & bulling as well as the 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade students.

<u>Ambulance Corp.</u> – Councilman Crossley reported they had their monthly meeting last night. Julie Tyler is now a CPR instruction and can do their in-house training. Unfortunately, we are losing a longtime volunteer Margaret Pierson who is moving, she was one of our better EMT's, He thanked her for her many years of dedicated services, she is truly going to be missed. Councilman added they are still in desperate need of volunteers.

<u>Beautification Committee</u> - Councilman Crossley reported the committee met last week to discuss phase II, their goal is to improve the front of Borough Hall and the Downtown Business Districts on Sheridan Avenue between Warren & North Franklin Turnpike. This is all dependent on their budget.

<u>Fire Department</u> - Councilman Shell reported the Fire Department was busy with Fire Prevention week going to schools talking about fire safety. They had their open house on Sunday, he continues to thank the volunteers

for all their dedicate and hard work. Lastly, CFO Joe Citro, Administrator Jones and himself had a meeting with Chief Dench to close out the capital expense item from the fiscal 2021 budget regarding radios.

<u>Chamber of Commerce</u> – Councilman Shell reported there is a lot of focus on restaurant week to bring people into the downtown.

<u>Police</u> – Chief LaCroix reported Capt. McBain and himself went before the accreditation board, and they are proud to report they passed and were extended for another (3) years. He thanked Capt. McBain who sphere headed as it is a lot of work. One item that was brought to their attention was a program called EAP (Employee Assistance Program) which is opened to Police Officers & a members of their family that may have alcohol dependance, marriageable problems. Psychologic issues etc. at a cost of \$2000. HHK will be the first Police Department to implement in Bergen County. Lastly, he reported Officer Garret Sweetman saved a man life at Matthew's Diner who was choking. He would like to honor him at the next meeting.

<u>DPW</u> - Jeff Pattman reported leave season will begin shortly.
