INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE 2022-66

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the <u>Mayor and Council</u> of the <u>Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus (the "Borough")</u> in the County of <u>Bergen</u> finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the <u>Mayor and Council</u> hereby determines that a <u>1%</u> increase in the budget for said year, amounting to <u>\$72,472</u> in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the <u>Mayor and Council</u> hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years. **NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the <u>Mayor and Council</u> of the <u>Borough</u> in the County of <u>Bergen</u>, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the <u>Borough</u> shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by <u>3.5%</u>, amounting to <u>\$253,653</u>, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the <u>Borough</u> be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and, **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5 the <u>BOROUGH</u> of <u>HO-HO-KUS</u> has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2022 budget year.

- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE 2022-67

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE V, CHAPTER 85, ZONING OF THE BOROUGH OF HO-HO-KUS

WHEREAS, the Borough seeks to establish criteria to clarify the definition of lot lines of corner lots; and **WHEREAS**, to further the goal of promoting appropriate light, air and open space on properties in the Borough; and **WHEREAS**, to establish appropriate relationship of buildings and structures on lots and between properties in residential and commercial zones, some amendments to the zoning ordinance are reasonable and appropriate.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus, in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, that Article III section §85-7 entitled "Word usage; definitions" is hereby amended and supplemented in the existing code in the following particulars only: (deleted sections are noted by strikethroughs, new sections are <u>underlined</u>)

Section 1. Amend section §85-7 B. by amending to add the following to the definition below:

LOT, CORNER

A plot or parcel of land at the junction of and fronting on two or more intersecting streets or a lot bounded on two or more sides by the same street. The rear lot line on a corner lot shall be the lot line most distant from the front lot lines or opposite the narrower front lot line. The remaining non-front lot lines shall be the side lot lines. Where a lot or tract contains two non-front lot lines that are equidistant from the front lot lines, then one of the non-front lot lines shall be designated as the rear lot line for purposes of identifying the rear yard setback requirement of the zone. The owner or their agent shall determine which of the equidistant non-front lot lines they intend to consider as their rear yard, and they shall then conform to the requirements of this chapter in accordance with such election. Once such a determination and election has been made as to any lot as recorded on the records of the Borough and the principal building is constructed, such determination shall be deemed to be a final election and cannot thereafter be altered.

<u>Section 2</u>. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, or any other part of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. The Borough Clerk is hereby directed to give notice at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing on the adoption of this ordinance to the Bergen County Planning Board, and to all others entitled thereto pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:55D-15. Upon adoption of this ordinance, after public hearing thereon, the Borough clerk is further directed to publish notice of the passage thereof and to file copy of this ordinance as finally adopted with the Bergen County Planning Board as required by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:55D-16 and with the Borough Tax Assessor.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final passage and publication as prescribed by law.

LIAISON REPORTS

<u>Recreation</u> – Councilman Iannelli reported Baseball, Soccer and Lacrosse are underway. There has been no COVID cases recorded, they are taking every precaution to avoid any outbreaks.

<u>Library</u> - Councilman Policastro reported The library now has a new circulation assistant as of February 28th. In February, the library circulated 2,588 print and digital items. This is an 11% decrease in circulation from the previous month, and a 19% decrease from the previous year.

<u>Board of Education</u> – Councilman Policastro reported On March 7th the Ho-Ho-Kus School moved to mask optional. On March 11th Dr. Mardy reported to the school community that the school switched to mask optional in a seamless fashion. On March 18 the State Department of Health notified the Ho-Ho-Kus Public School that it reached outbreak status for Covid cases. There were significant clusters in more than half of the grade levels and *one class, and a grade level*, learned remotely the previous 3 days. Today, Dr. Mardy indicated to me that the school has seen a decrease in cases which is promising. Although not required, the New Jersey Department of Health strongly recommends schoolwide masking during an outbreak.

<u>Ambulance Corp</u>. Councilman Crossley reported they had their meeting last night. The Department is still looking for volunteers as they are very short staffed, especially during the day. They have been advertising on Social Media and in the paper. Discussed at the meeting was mutual aid which as not be done since before COVID, however, other towns are short staffed as well. Looking at various classes to be held at the Ambulance Building.

MAYOR'S REMARKS

Mayor added a resolution regarding the support of the People of Ukraine and Their Sovereignty and asked the Council to approve.

Resolution #22-52

<u>A Resolution – In Support of the People of Ukraine and Their Sovereignty</u>

WHEREAS, on January 21, 1990, more than 300,000 Ukrainians formed a human chain between Kyiv and Ivano-Frankivsk in an effort to bring forth unity and independence from the Soviet Union; and

WHEREAS, on December 1, 1991, a national referendum in support of independence was voted upon by more than 90 percentof Ukrainian citizens, with majorities in every region; and

WHEREAS, under the guise of military exercises, the Russian military conducted a large-scale buildup in and around Ukrainein March and April 2021, leaving significant military equipment behind; and

WHEREAS, subsequent thereto, in October 2021, the Russian military conducted an even larger military backup thatculminated in approximately 190,000 forces by the time of Russia's renewed full-scale incursion on February 24, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on February 21, 2022, the State Duma of Russia passed a bill that was approved by President Vladimir Putin to officially recognize the self-proclaimed Luhansk People's Republic and Donetsk People's Republic as independent, and then ordered troops into those territories after recognizing their independence; and

WHEREAS, on February 24, 2022, Russian forces, enabled by Belarus, launched its unprovoked full-scale renewed invasion of the peaceful, independent country of Ukraine; and

WHEREAS, it is the right of all countries to decide its own future, foreign policy and security arrangements free from outside interference and/or coercion; and

WHEREAS, also on February 24, 2022, the G7 issued a statement condemning the "large-scale military aggression by the Russian Federation against the territorial integrity, sovereignty and independence of Ukraine"; and

WHEREAS, on February 25, 2022, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) condemned "in the strongest possible terms Russia's horrifying attack on Ukraine", called on Russia "to turn back from the path of violence and aggression" and reaffirmed an "iron-clad" commitment to Article 5; and

WHEREAS, the European Commission, France, Germany, Italy, the United Kingdom and Canada, along with the United States, committed to coordinated economic sanctions, including severe restrictions against Russia's Central Bank and full blocking sanctions against Vladimir Putin; and

WHEREAS, United States leadership is integral to nations around the world in condemning and imposing costs on the Russian Federation for its illegal, full-scale, renewed invasion of Ukraine; and

WHEREAS, it has been reported that Russian forces have targeted civilians which would constitute war crimes and crimes against humanity; and

WHEREAS, the United States, along with allies in Europe, the Indo-Pacific and others around the world, has been actively responding to Russia's unprovoked war of aggression against Ukraine with critical military, humanitarian and financial support for Ukraine and the Ukrainian people; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has numerous residents of Ukrainian decent, some of whom are located in the Township of Wayne and neighboring communities; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the residents of the Township to support the people of Ukraine in protecting their sovereignty.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus that it:

- Unequivocally supports Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity;
- Affirms the continued use of peaceful methods including sanctions by the United States (as well as its allies and partners) to fully isolate the Putin regime economically for its unprovoked aggression against Ukraine;
- Supports the resistance by the Ukrainian people as long as the Russian Federation continues to violate Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity;
- Declares that the war in Ukraine, a democratic country, represents the frontline of democracy and freedom versus authoritarianism represented by Putin's government;
- Supports the State of New Jersey's suspension of relationships with businesses and financial institutions backed by the Russian government; and
- Stands steadfastly, staunchly, proudly and fervently behind the Ukrainian people in their fight against the authoritarian Putin regime; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Clerk shall forward certified copies of this Resolution to Governor Phil Murphy, members of the Legislature representing the 40th Legislative District, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

A motion was offered by Council President Troast and seconded by Councilman Crossley to approve Resolutions 22-52. Motion carried on a roll call vote – All present voting "Aye".

ADJOURNMENT

On a motion by Councilman Crossley, seconded by Councilman Iannelli, the meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m. Motion Carried by voice vote – all present voting "Aye".
